ARISE aims to construct academic networks of international co-operation within Africa. The most important output of the project will be the development of a sustainable network for intra-African mobility in the fields of Food Security and Sustainable Human Well-being.

Activities within ARISE will have a clear link to sustainable development, thereby contributing to the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals. ARISE will offer 100 scholarship opportunities.

Impact

- Contribution to the improvement of the quality of higher education through the promotion of internationalisation, and harmonisation of programmes and curricula within participating institutions;
- Enhancement of the international cooperation and capacity of higher education institutions in Africa,
- Access to higher education for students including those from disadvantaged groups;
- Ensuring that academic skills and expertise on the continent is maintained and brain drain is prevented.

ARISE Partners are dedicated to mobilizing platforms that increase brain circulation on the continent. The complimentary nature of study programmes made available through ARISE allows greater access to relevant thematic fields and research opportunities which is in line with the notion of nurturing the migration of high level expertise to counteract the “greener pasture paradigm” and possible brain drain on the continent.

Mobility

Target Groups

Group 1

African nationals and/ or residents registered in one of the Higher Education Institutions that is member of the consortium. Please note that applicants cannot apply for funding that does not support cross border mobility.

Group 2

African nationals and residents (students) registered in a higher education institution of African countries not included in the partnership, or who have obtained a higher education institution degree or equivalent from an institution of these countries. This allows for providing mobility opportunities to students working in public administration, public and private enterprises. Please note that applicants cannot apply for funding that does not support cross border mobility.

Intra-ACP

The Intra-ACP Academic Mobility Scheme foresees student and staff mobility within the African, Caribbean and Pacific band of countries through strengthening the expansion of the African Union Commission (AUC) Mwalimu Nyerere Programme.

The European Commission, in partnership with ACP Secretariat, oversees the management of the Intra-ACP academic mobility scheme. The programme is managed and implemented by the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA).

Scholarship

- One round-trip flight ticket and visa costs.
- Participation Costs: The participation costs may cover tuition and / or registration fees, additional library, student unions and laboratory consumable costs.
- Comprehensive medical cover (Health, Accident and Travel).
- A monthly subsistence allowance for the mobility period from which participant settles accommodation expenses.
